Councillor Nichol provided a very informative update on the last LSAC meeting held on Feb.20th. Highlights include: new Rural Task Force Committee that was formed through TVDSB and that Deputy Mayor Cornelissen has been appointed through County Council to sit on the committee; bus transportation being provided that is taking students from North Middlesex to area schools such as Medway and SDCI; lack of follow up from school when students apply for boundary change due to wanting a specific course however some do not even enroll in that course after acceptance into the school; LSAC was advised that Medway has recently denied 6 boundary changes from North Middlesex Students however the Clerk further updated that unofficially she had heard Medway ended up accepting the students; unofficial enrolment figures were provided from the NM feeder schools which has indicated that the majority of Grade 8 students from East Williams and McGillivray are intending on going to Medway or SDCI; active parent/school council group from NMDHS hosted a parent to parent information night to try and determine why parents are encouraging attendance at schools outside of the boundary for North Middlesex – this same group is wanting to work with the feeder schools to assess future needs of students by starting with Grade 6 and up. Council engaged in a discussion on the positive aspects of our highschool and feeder schools and will be engaging with them to provide support in various capacities as this is a high local investment for the community.
