6. DELEGATIONS:

7:45 p.m. – Brenda Slater, Municipal Relations Representative from MPAC attended Council to provide an overview on "Understanding Property Assessment in Ontario". MPAC is responsible for accurately assessing and classifying all properties in Ontario in accordance with the Assessment Act and regulations established by the Ontario Government. MPAC's assessments provide the foundation on which all 444 municipalities across Ontario calculate property taxes, and are based on what a willing buyer would pay a willing seller for a property on a legislated valuation date. To establish that value, MPAC reviews sales of comparable sold properties in the neighbourhood and other key features that affect market value. Those values are provided to municipalities, who use the assessments to calculate property taxes. Municipalities determine their revenue requirements, set municipal tax rates and collect property taxes.

Several questions were asked by Council and responded to by Ms. Slater. The Mayor thanked her for the informative presentation.

ROPP/CORNELISSEN: The Council of the Municipality of North Middlesex supports the bill from Ernie Hardeman, MPP Oxford as follows:

WHEREAS social housing providers in Ontario are currently required to purchase natural gas and insurance through the Housing Services Corporation (HSC) or pay a fee to purchase elsewhere; and

WHEREAS social housing providers should have the right to obtain natural gas and insurances at the lowest cost to provide value to those in need of affordable housing and all tax payers; and

WHEREAS the HSC should be subject the same level of accountability and oversight as government agencies;

THEREFORE BE IT resolved that the Council of the Municipality of North Middlesex supports the Housing Services Corporation Accountability Act introduced by Oxford MPP Ernie Hardeman which would remove the mandatory requirement for social housing providers to purchase gas and insurance through the HSC to report salaries over \$100,000 and give the Provincial Auditor General the authority to audit HSC.
