8. DELEGATIONS

a. CAO Bill Rayburn and Warden Maudsley - County of Middlesex update

Mr. Rayburn and Warden Maudsley reviewed their power point presentation which contained updates regarding the Budget timetable, Budget overview, Visioning sessions (local services review and governance), 50 King Street update (Health Unit Building), Comprehensive library update, Healthy kids program, Ambulance 101, Agricultural forum, WOWC, SWIFT, Accessibility Update and Economic Development Update. Several questions were asked about the updates from the County and responded to by the delegation. Mayor Shipway thanked Mr. Rayburn and Warden Maudsley for attending the meeting.

b.Chris Carrier from Fire Marque Inc.

Mr. Carrier provided a power point presentation about Fire Marque's Indemnification Technology cost recovery program for Municipal Fire Services. The program is designed to recover some fire department expenses incurred from responding to property related insured peril calls. He explained that this program does not cover motor vehicle accidents. There is no annual fee or minimum fee in order to implement the program. The recovery is allocated 70% to municipality and 30% to Fire Marque. Several questions were asked by Council and responded to by Mr. Carrier. Mayor Shipway thanked the delegation for his presentation.

Later in the meeting, it was suggested that staff contact municipalities that are participating in the program to receive feedback on the process.

ROPP/MOIR: That the Council of the Municipality of North Middlesex hereby supports the motion from the Municipality of Bluewater as follows:

"Whereas Ontario's growing and aging population is putting an increasing strain on our publicly-funded health care system;

And whereas since February 2015, the Ontario government has made an almost 7% unilateral cut to physician services expenditures which cover all the care doctors provide to patients-including cuts to programs which are specifically designed to act as incentives for physicians to practice in rural areas;

And Whereas the decisions Ontario makes today will impact patients' access to quality care in the years to come and these cuts will threaten access to the quality, patient-focused care Ontarians need and expect;

And Whereas Ontario in experiencing a growing rural population as retirees move to the countryside;

And Whereas many rural municipalities in Ontario have formed physician recruitment and retention committees and strategies to deal with the reality of physicians retirements and shortages;

And Whereas rural areas in Ontario are already at a distinct disadvantage in recruiting family physicians due to a number of factors;

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the Council of the Municipality of Bluewater hereby requests that the Minister of Health and Long Term Care reinstate incentives for

physicians to practice in rural areas of Ontario, and that the minister return to the table with Ontario's doctors and work together through mediation-arbitration to reach a fair deal that protects the quality, patient-focused care Ontario families deserve;

And Be It Further Resolved that copies of this resolution be sent to the Premier of Ontario, the federal and provincial Ministers of Health, the Ontario College of Physicians and Surgeons, and all municipalities in Ontario"

ROPP/HEMMING: BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council hereby feels it is appropriate to rescind Motion #361/2015, passed on December 2, 2015, in order to provide clarity to the purpose of the establishment of a recently formed Committee;

And that Council deems it appropriate to establish an Advisory Committee which shall be comprised of interested members of the community and no more than three appointed council members;

And further that the purpose of the committee would be to identify issues and recommend solutions on the declining enrolment of all North Middlesex schools which impacts the curriculum and possibly the quality of education for the students and potentially have economic impact on the community;

And further that the Advisory Committee shall compose a comprehensive assessment of issues and recommendations to Council for consideration on solutions that the Municipality would then be able to provide to Thames Valley District School Board.

Councillor Cornelissen inquired into whether the municipality was in receipt of any information pertaining to possible billings from the OPP for incidents relating to the Wind Turbines. Mayor Shipway advised that he has spoke to Staff Sergeant Thompson and that he would provide any information and updates when received.
