#### **MINUTES**

The Council of the Municipality of North Middlesex met on March 26, 2001 to complete the business of the March 19, 2001 agenda.

Councillor Coutts declared the following pecuniary interest "I, Marysia Coutts, declare that I may have a pecuniary interest in the matter of petition of Drainage Works – East Williams".

Administrator Scott advised that no new agenda was prepared, as the meeting was called to complete the business of the March 19 meeting.

### **PARKING**

A concerned citizen commented on illegal parking on Hastings Street and in front of the Library, by the local ambulance service. Council suggested that our By-law Enforcement Officer be made aware, and that correspondence be forwarded to the ambulance service and the County of Middlesex.

Also mentioned was unavailable wheelchair access to the Library. Council were advised that this was a Carnegie Building. Although an addition would be a solution, the heritage of the building makes this difficult. The citizen is to be advised of available alternative services, and of the co-operation of existing library staff.

The Multi-Service Centre on King Street requested accessible parking, a curb cut and signage in front of 183-185 King Street. The matter is to be discussed between the Public Works Superintendent and the By-Law Enforcement Officer, for a draft policy.

#### **EXEMPTING LEGION TAXES**

Deputy Mayor Brebner advised that the request made to the County on exemption of property taxes has been referred to Committee for a recommendation. Administrator Scott advised that she discussed the decision made by Strathroy Caradoc with the same party, and was advised that they had exempted the local portion only. They suggested the legion could approach the school boards for exemption of that part of the levy.

After considering the above information, the following motion was made.

HENDRIKX-MCLACHLAN: BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council exempt the two Legions in Parkhill and Ailsa Craig from the municipal portion of property taxes for 2001,2002,2003. If they want to be exempt from the education portion they should approach the School Boards.

Councillor Johnston advised that Ailsa Craig is putting up signs to address somewhat the same problem. Council suggested that the County be requested to do the same for Parkhill. Public Works Superintendent Adams was asked to make drawings to accompany a letter, illustrating our needs. A copy of the County authority to ticket provisions are to be requested. A copy of the policies and procedures were received.

### **WATERLINE**

Public Works Superintendent Adams reported that he feels the staff are in a position to take on the duties of sampling and reporting for the Nairn waterline. This had been reviewed by OCWA, and it is agreed that due to the timing of their sampling, it would create less bureaucracy to do within our own system, and eliminate some duplication. Mr. Adams felt we could also monitor the line closer ourselves. Council were also advised that the Ailsa Craig agreement had not been renewed and a meeting would probably be scheduled in the near future. It was stated that some agreements with OCWA state that notice of six months to one year is required to change agreements. Mike Steeper had been retained at the regular rate to read and check the Parkhill system.

### TRACKLESS UNIT

Public Works Superintendent Adams reported on price received for twin head, hydraulic driven trackless MT5 Tractor unit, discussed at previous meeting. He recommended that the blower be sold with the existing unit and the purchase be made with 51" blower. A 10' demo rotary mower is also included in order to accommodate needs for the ball and soccer fields.

### REPAIR TO TOW ROAD FOR McGILLIVRAY

Public Works Superintendent Adams reported that 400' has already been rebuild and 1400' of road has been moved earlier this year. A temporary wall has been put in place. Alec Scott with ABCA has advised on a design that will work. According to Section 281 ort 285 of the Municipal Act, the County has some responsibility, but when Ken Oake and Dennis Merrill of Middlesex County and Jim Katewin of Lambton Shores, met last fall, at the site, there was no support agreed upon. In order to stabilize, a drain 10' deep, on the field side, is required. An estimate of this work is \$10,000. Sloping of a tow is estimated at \$20,000. Concrete from area silos is now available for rip rap. A decision has to be made as we do not loose the concrete, if required. Something must be done or, the road will have to be moved.

In the past McGillivray has absorbed the cost of construction and Bosanquet has top dressed and removed the snow. There are no provisions to close the road. It was suggested a proposal be drawn for the County and Lambton Shores to consider. The Engineer work is done. Further information will be available at a future meeting.

### **SPRING CLEAN UP**

Public Works Superintendent Adams reported there has been no information received on the use of McGillivray Landfill Site. Past fee structures for drop and hours of operation were discussed.

A report is to be submitted for consideration in the near future.

### **LABOUR RELATIONS**

Public Works Superintendent Adams advised that the Mayor, Administrator and himself along with Jack Coups met with the Ministry of Labour and representatives from both unions. A description of the bargaining unit and a list of eligible voters was settled. Arrangements have been made for the Union to meet with eligible staff on April 2, 2001 and the vote for SEIU representation, CUPE representation, or non union status will be held on April 3, 2001.
