

MUNICIPALITY OF NORTH MIDDLESEX REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

The Regular Meeting of the Council of the Municipality of North Middlesex was held on Wednesday October 21, 2015 in the Council Chambers, Shared Services Centre, 229 Parkhill Main Street, Parkhill with a quorum present.

4. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

a. Regular Meeting Minutes from October 7, 2015

CORNELISSEN/MOIR: That the regular meeting minutes dated October 7, 2015 be

hereby accepted as presented.

5. PUBLIC MEETING

6. DELEGATIONS

8:00 p.m. Charlene McNair and Trevor Moore attended Council to present fundraising proceeds which are earmarked for the shade structure at the Ailsa Craig Community Park. A cheque was presented from the street dance event in the amount of \$5,896.64. A commitment of \$10,000 (in total) over a three year period from Women on a Mission with an initial cheque of \$1,000.00 was also provided. In addition a presentation was made from the Girl Guides of Ailsa Craig for a tree they wish to donate to the park and from proceeds with bake sales they are working towards donating a bench as well.

Council congratulated all the groups for their exceptional fundraising efforts. It is very much appreciated.

CORNELISSEN/MOIR: That the staff report regarding the site plan progress for the property at 2131 Elliot Drive be received by Council;

That Council direct staff to proceed with the necessary paperwork in order for the easement for the municipal drain to be registered on title at the appropriate time as the project progresses;

And further that Council authorizes the \$4,000.00 expenditure as the work will benefit the Municipality;

And further that staff be directed to instruct the municipal lawyer to prepare the necessary encroachment agreement to be registered on title at no cost to the municipality.

Council expressed that they would like a financial report that shows revenue and expenses more frequently (ie: Canteen). It was suggested that this could occur bimonthly through the Finance Dept. Also, it was suggested that advertising should be considered to try and encourage more ice rentals as well as promoting all our facilities availability. Frequency of outdoor maintenance at the Shared Services Building was also discussed.

CORNELISSEN/MCLINCHEY: That Council concurred that the sign style preference for the Elginfield Road/McLeod Street entrance be single pedestal with the rounded corners.

ROPP/NICHOL: That Council receive and file the Quarterly 2015 Report from the Recreation/Facilities Department as submitted.

- 1. To increase awareness about and encourage the use of trails.
 - 2. To enhance trails and the trail experience
 - 3. To protect trails for today's generation and future generations
 - 4. To recognize the contribution that trails make to quality of life in Ontario.

And Whereas the Association of Municipalities of Ontario has had input into this Bill looking out for municipal interests;

And whereas the Bill includes stronger penalties for property damage and trespassing to discourage such actions;

And whereas the Bill will be asking for best practices to be created and will have participation in these practices be voluntary THEREFORE not creating undue hardship on the Municipality;

NOW THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED THAT the Municipality of Greenstone supports the overall direction Bill 100 Supporting the Ontario Trails Act

AND FURTHER LET IT BE RESOLVED THAT the Municipality of Greenstone encourages the government to continue to work with stakeholder such as NOMA, ROMA, and the OFA to enhance the liability and trespass provisions of the Bill."
