Whereas there have been numerous serious and fatal collisions that have required the closing of the 401, impacting the safety of residents on detour routes with increased heavy truck traffic.

Therefore be it resolved that Council pass a resolution calling on the provincial government to install said barriers and that the mayor draft a letter highlighting the above concerns, and that both the motion and the accompanying letter be circulated be circulated to the: Premier of Ontario, The Honourable Kathleen Wynne, The Minister of Transportation, the Honourable Steven Del Duca and the surrounding municipalities on the 401 corridor from Windsor to London.
