



Notice of Public Information Session Organics “Green Bin” Program Proposal

As a next step in local waste diversion, the Bluewater Recycling Association (BRA), in partnership with TRY Recycling, is proposing the introduction of a curbside organics collection “green bin” program.

BRA’s proposed curbside organics collection program would introduce a third “green bin” stream for:

- Food waste (meats, dairy, grains, fruits, vegetables, sauces, oils)
- Yard trimmings (grass, weeds, brush, leaves, branches)
- Soiled paper (napkins, paper towels, egg cartons)

Residents are invited to attend one of the upcoming Public Information Sessions to learn more about the proposed program, its benefits, and potential impacts. Municipal staff and representatives from both the Bluewater Recycling Association and Try Recycling will be available to answer questions and receive feedback.
